Examinations—Autumn 1983

The Autumn 1983 MRCPsych Examinations will take place on the following dates:

Preliminary Test: 28 September 1983. Closing date for receipt of entries—22 June 1983.

Membership Examination: 2 November 1983 (written papers); 7 to 10 November 1983 (clinical and oral). Closing date for receipt of entries—13 July 1983.

The entry fees are £50 and £90 respectively. Late or incomplete entries are not accepted. The College does not give exemption from any part of the examinations. Candidates are reminded that they must pass the Membership Examination within five years of passing the Preliminary Test.
