

Medical Geography in Historical Perspective

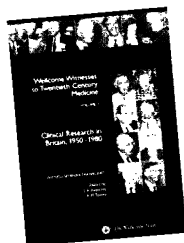

The early practitioners of medical geography were concerned with the global distribution of human diseases as a function of large-scale environmental conditions, and in Germany, France and Britain, large bodies of literature on the subject were produced. In recent years, medical geography has experienced a resurgence of popularity, and historians have begun examining the issues it raised. Most of the chapters in this book are based on papers presented at a symposium held in June 1996 in Göttingen. They cover a wide range of themes from European national practices and cultural discourses, to ethnographic representations of disease, and the perceptions of colonists in the American West.

The Wellcome Trust Centre's History of Twentieth Century Medicine Group promotes interaction between medical scientists, clinicians and historians of twentieth century medicine. A component of the group's activity is to gather together significant figures in twentieth-century medicine to discuss specific discoveries or events and debate their achievements, their failings, and the consequences and impacts of their work.

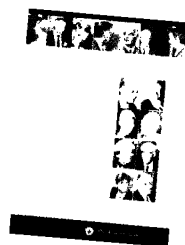


The resulting debates are published in the Wellcome Witnesses to Twentieth Century Medicine seminar transcripts, two new volumes of which have just been published.

The first volume, 7, is a fascinating insight into *Clinical Research in Britain, 1950-1980*, and examines the growth of clinical research in the UK since the Second World War, including the 1953 Cohen Report and the subsequent creation of the Medical Research Council's Clinical Research Board.

The second new addition to the series, volume 8, focuses on the key aspects of *Intestinal Absorption*, including good work on basic physiological mechanisms and techniques, such as the discovery of dedicated transport systems and their localization, and their clinical impact in intestinal disorders and oral rehydration therapy.

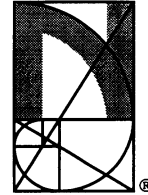
