Step-by-step instructions on the website explain the submission process. Manuscripts must be double-spaced typescript throughout, with citations prepared according to the *Chicago Manual of Style*, 15th ed. The *Review's* style guides for articles and book reviews are available on the *LHR* web page at journals.cambridge.org/lhr. Please use word processing. Submitted manuscripts are subject to double-blind peer review; authors should therefore identify themselves on the title page only. Accepted manuscripts are copyedited for style but not substance; authors remain responsible for citation accuracy and for all statements of fact or opinion. *Law and History Review* will not consider any manuscript concurrently submitted for publication elsewhere. Submission of a manuscript is understood to commit its author to publish the manuscript in *Law and History Review* if accepted by the editor.
