

This is a study of the process of decolonization, the development of the nationalist movement, and the salient aspects of the emerging post-independence policy in the Congo since 1945. The author considers the forces set loose by the Leopoldville explosion that uprooted a history of colonial rule. He distinguishes the elements of this experience and evaluates its impact on the African. Crawford Young based his analysis on first-hand investigation in seventeen provinces of the Congo, and interviews with local administrators in more than half the territories of former Leopoldville Province.
