Postgraduate Bursaries in Engineering

Bursaries are available for the Session 1974/75 to students normally resident in the United Kingdom for courses of postgraduate study (not research) in Aeronautical, Chemical, Civil, Electrical and Mechanical Engineering, Computing and Control, Industrial Sociology, Management Science, and Materials Science and Technology.

The courses are normally of one year's duration, leading to the Diploma of Membership of the Imperial College (D.I.C.) and, for suitably qualified candidates the M.Sc. Degree of the University of London. Applicants must be graduates who have spent at least one year away from University since graduation, preferably in industry.

The value of the bursaries will range from £695 according to circumstances, plus College (but not University) fees.

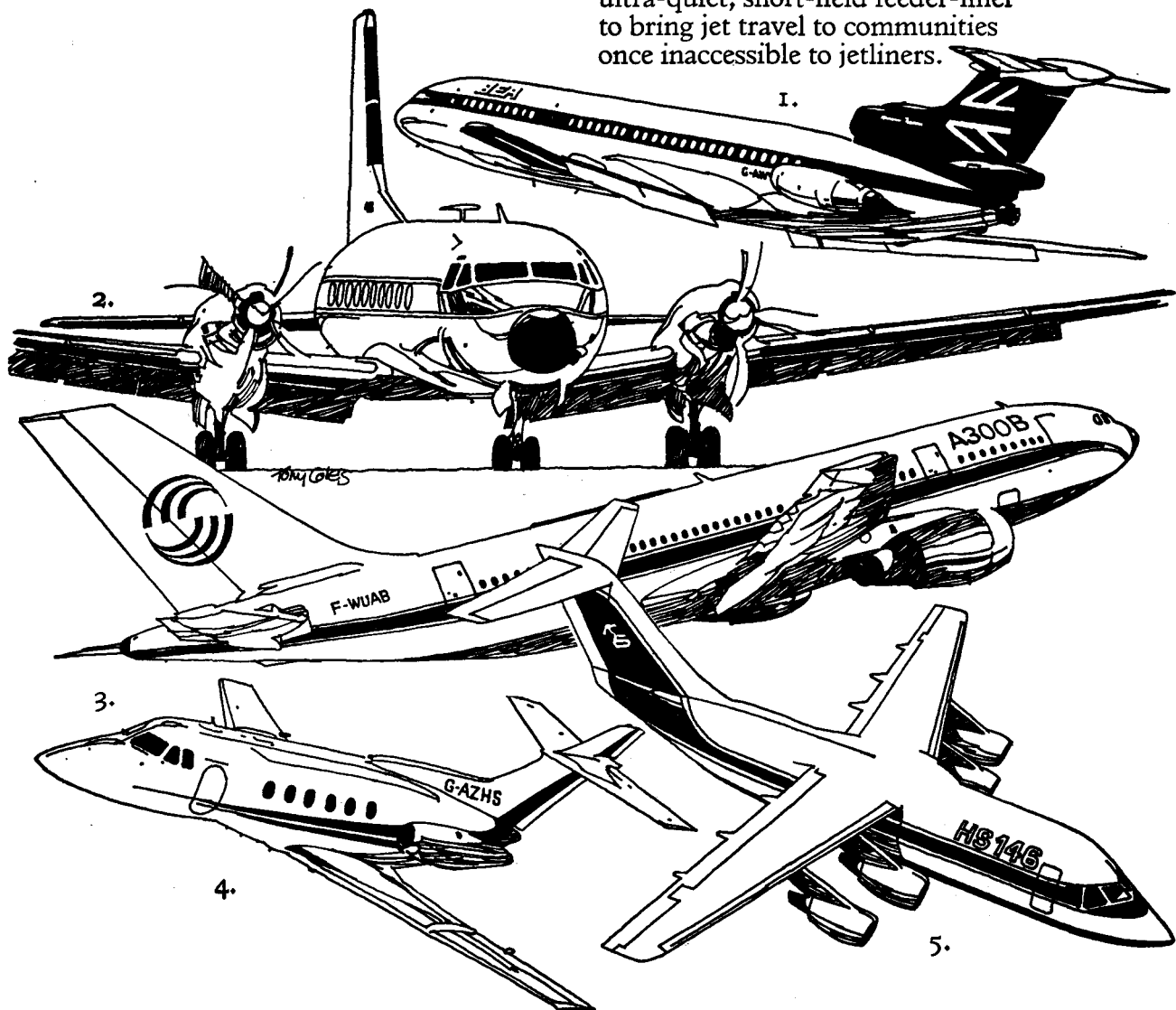
