TOTALITARIANISM AT THE CROSSROADS

edited and with an introduction by Ellen Frankel Paul

In recent years, the one remaining totalitarian empire has appeared to be in decline, claiming that it is suffering from economic stagnation, budget deficits, crippling military expenditures, and an insupportable burden of subsidy for its colonies. *Totalitarianism at the Crossroads* is chiefly devoted to the genesis, the current state, and the possible future of the Soviet Union and Eastern Europe. The contributors to this volume – the émigré dissident Vladimir Bukovsky, Sovietologist Adam Ulam, Polish émigrés Andrzej Walicki and Zbigniew Rau, and political philosophers John Gray and Roger Scruton – examine various aspects of totalitarianism with particular emphasis upon the Soviet Union, its Eastern European satellites, and the bloody retrenchment in China.
