Memorial to

Henry Alan Marsh, AFC, AFR AeS

A number of those who knew Alan Marsh have suggested that in view of his inspiring and selfless devotion to the development of rotary-wing aircraft, and the prominent place that he took in forming the Helicopter Association of Great Britain, a memorial to him should be organised by the Association. The proposal was welcomed and endorsed by the Executive Council who have therefore decided to set up a Trust to administer such funds as may be contributed for the purpose

The Trustees appointed by the Council are

The Memorial is to take the form of

- 1 Monetary grants to be known as Alan Marsh Memorial Awards, to aid young persons employed in the helicopter and associated industries—including pilotage, design, development, construction and operation in the widest sense—to obtain further education, and thus expand their qualifications for a career in the industry
- 2 The award of medals to be known as Alan Marsh Memorial Medals, to individuals for outstanding work in any of the fields associated with the science and practice of helicopter engineering and operation

The trust fund has been opened by a gift of fifty guineas from the Association and an initial gift of £250 from Mr A J MOLLART, of the Mollart Engineering Co

Contributions are now invited from all bodies and individuals who may like to take part in honouring Alan Marsh's memory

Contributions can take the form of donations or annual subscriptions, the latter preferably under "Deed of Covenant" over a period of seven years, in order that the Trust may apply for refund of income tax upon such subscriptions, their value being thus almost doubled For example, a gift of £50 in the form of seven annual subscriptions, under "Deed of Covenant," of £7 3s 0d each year, would bring to the Trust a total of about £91, while income tax is at the present level of 9s 0d in the pound
