The text provides a summary of Biblical history, from the nomad origins of the Chosen People to the Coming of Christ and the expansion of His Church.

The encyclopaedic 26-page index contains every place named in the Bible, with the main variants of spellings, as well as the names of people with notes on the more important personages.
