Placing both against the Greco-Roman background of their time, these essays illuminate various texts, ideas and religious movements in Judaism and Christianity. This book contributes to exegesis of ancient texts as well as to the history of Rabbinic Judaism and Christianity.

Careful attention to methodologies in the study of religious documents makes the essays in this volume particularly valuable. Scholars and students alike will benefit from the lucid prose exposition of ancient texts and ideologies. Topics as varied as sin, polemic, the Trinity, Mariology, Jewish-Christianity and Biblical exegesis capture Burton

Visotzky's attention here. An introductory essay offers an overview of the field, the background milieu of the literatures and assesses recent contributions of American, Israeli and European scholars.

IL MONACHESIMO MODERNO TRA RAGION DI CHIESA E RAGION DI STATO

IL CASO TOSCANO
(XVI-XIX SEC.)

La storiografia più autorevole ha da tempo individuato nelle vicende istituzionali delle varie corporazioni religiose, nella ricostruzione delle loro relazioni reciproche, nella struttura sociale e patrimoniale dei conventi, uno dei nodi centrali delle relazioni tra Stato e Chiesa in età moderna.

In tale prospettiva questo volume – che analizza la parabola storica delle più importanti congregazioni benedettine attive in Toscana nei secoli XVI-XIX – intende confrontare due «logiche» dominanti: quella della ricostituzione ecclesiastica post-tridentina e quella dello «Stato moderno» in via di consolidamento. Intende, inoltre, mettere in evidenza come l'ordinamento canonico, la fisionomia organizzativa e la stessa evoluzione dei modelli di «stato religioso» siano stati condizionati dagli sforzi di razionalizzazione operati da Roma, mediante l'introduzione di meccanismi di contenimento nel periodo post-tridentino, la promozione di unioni tra diversi istituti, gli interventi di riequilibrio degli spazi di azione tra gli ordini religiosi e il clero secolare, i tentativi di riforma statutaria e disciplinare intrapresi dai papi del Seicento fino a Pio IX.

Parallelamente all'azione pontificia, il potere politico ha inizialmente imposto una configurazione tendenzialmente 'nazionale' alla rete dei monasteri, poi, con l'avvento dei «sovrani illuminati», ha attuato un riassetto organizzativo e una parziale riconversione sociale del patrimonio delle congregazioni. I primi tre lustri dell'800 segnarono, infine, un momento di svolta radicale con le secolarizzazioni napoleoniche e la successiva restaurazione «concordataria» degli ordini. La compenetrazione di questi processi – quello ecclesiastico-romano e quello politico-locale – così come le resistenze opposte dalle congregazioni benedettine, hanno contribuito a caratterizzare in termini nuovi non solo la fisionomia «costituzionale» del monachesimo, ma anche la sua «identità» religioso-culturale.
