Submission of manuscripts by disk, using an MS-DOS operating system, must be accompanied by two letter quality hard copies. Please specify which wordprocessor (and its version number) has been used. We request that authors use endnotes, not footnotes. In the absence of disks, two double-spaced copies of the manuscript are required. Manuscripts should conform to the *Chicago Manual of Style*, especially in endnote form. Manuscripts should not exceed 10,000 words and for their return be accompanied by postage.

BOOK REVIEWS evaluate the scholarly quality of books, their contribution to the field, and relevance to other literature. *Albion* does not accept unsolicited book reviews, and does not underwrite the opinions of its reviewers. Persons interested in writing reviews should send a vita to the editor. Proposals for review essays concerning the historiography of a field, era, or important theme in British history are encouraged. They should be communicated to the editor.
