By F. A. R. BENNION, M.A.(OXON.), *Barrister-at-Law; Technical Adviser to the Government of Ghana on the preparation of legislation (1959-1961); sometime Lecturer and Tutor in Law at St. Edmund Hall, Oxford*

In 1960 Ghana adopted a Republican Constitution, which had many novel features, being a blend of British, American, and African constitutional ideas. The author of this book took an active part in the preparation of the new legislation, and is therefore extremely well qualified to present this authoritative exposition of the Constitutional Law of Ghana. Not only does the author expound the provisions of the law as they exist, he also gives a certain amount of technical help wherever necessary. In this way he does much to lessen the problems facing those who suddenly find themselves confronted with such a mass of unfamiliar legislation.

This new book in Butterworths *African Law Series* deals with the law relating to land and movables in Iboland, an area in the Eastern Region of Nigeria with a population of about six million. Also covered are such things as fishing and hunting rights, succession, sale and women's rights, but although the theme is mainly customary law the effects of the impact of English legal ideas have been indicated. Courts and practitioners in Nigeria will find this a valuable book, and it should be of wide interest elsewhere to all who are interested in the study of African customary law.
