



The journal publishes timely, high quality articles from a variety of disciplines, including history, political science, sociology, anthropology, and literature. Nationalities Papers is the journal of the Association for the Study of Nationalities, bringing together scholars worldwide working on nationalism and ethnicity, Central and Eastern Europe, the Balkans and Eurasia. All articles have undergone rigorous peer review, based on initial editor screening and double-blind refereeing by a minimum of two anonymous referees.

The journal welcomes submissions from multiple disciplines and different methodological approaches from scholars around the world. In addition to individual paper submissions, the journal also welcomes proposals for special symposia (3-5 articles) on specific regional or disciplinary themes. All symposia will undergo the same peer review process as other articles. Articles should be between 8,000 and 10,000 words in length (including notes and bibliography).

Electronic Submission. All submissions should be made online at the *Nationalities Papers* Manuscript Central site (http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/CNAP). New users should first create an account. Once a user is logged onto the site submissions should be made via the Author Centre. Authors should prepare and upload two versions of their manuscript. One should be a complete text, while in the second all document information identifying the author should be removed from files to allow them to be sent anonymously to referees. When uploading files authors will then be able to define the non-anonymous version as "File not for review".
