

CALL FOR PAPERS

The 1985 Annual Meeting of the American Society of Church History will be held in New York, New York, 27–30 December 1985. The program committee welcomes proposals for entire sessions, individual papers or panels. Papers may be on any aspect of the history of Christianity. Each proposal must include an abstract that summarizes its thesis, method, and significance, together with a *curriculum vitae* for each participant.

Please send proposals to Professor David C. Steinmetz, The Divinity School, Duke University, Durham, NC 27706. The deadline for submission is 15 January 1985.

PHILIP SCHAFF PRIZE

The American Society of Church History takes pleasure in announcing the 1983–1984 Philip Schaff Prize. The prize is in the amount of \$1,000.00 to be paid to the author of the best book originating in the North American scholarly community, and presenting original research or interpretation in the history of Christianity or any period thereof.

Books considered for this award must be published during the years 1983 or 1984. Any member of the Society may nominate titles for consideration for the Schaff Prize. Copies of books do not have to be submitted. Titles nominated for consideration of the award must be received by the Chairperson of the Committee on Research of the Society or William B. Miller, Secretary, American Society of Church History, 305 East Country Club Lane, Wallingford, PA 19086, by 1 March 1985. The announcement of the winner of the Schaff Prize will be made at the annual meeting of the Society in December 1985.

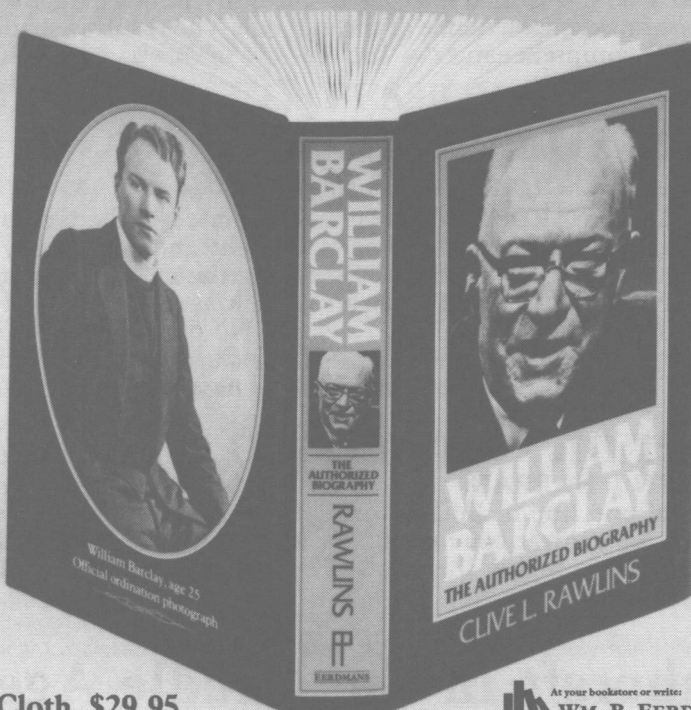
The award will be announced at the spring meeting of the Society in 1985.

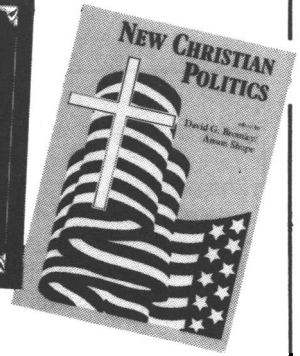
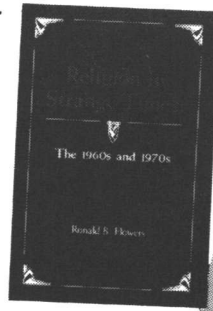
