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Pennycook is a corporate fellow in the Materials Sciences and Technology Division at Oak Ridge National Laboratory and leader of the Electron Microscopy Group. He holds a BA, MA, and PhD degrees from the University of Cambridge, UK. His current research interests focus on the development of Z-contrast scanning transmission electron microscopy and electron energy-loss

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Colliex is the research director for the Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique in the Solid State Physics Laboratory at Université Paris Sud, Orsay, France. He has led the electron microscopy group for more than 30 years, focusing on instrumental and methodological developments, in particular in EELS spectroscopy and STEM imaging.

Colliex has thus focused many efforts on promoting spectroscopic imaging to the identification of a single atom. From 2006 to 2010, he was president of the International Federation of Microscopy Societies. He also has been the laureate of several national and international awards over the past few years (the France-Taiwan grand prize, the Holweck medal from the Institute of Physics and the Société Française de Physique, and the Grande Médaille of the French Society for Metallurgy and Materials Science).

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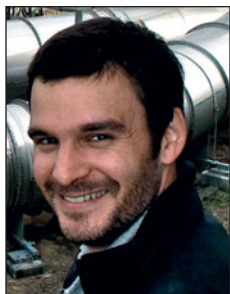
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
