The Economics of Anabaptism: 1525-1560 is an important addition to the body of information and interpretation available on the biblical restitutionists of the 16th century. The author has done an excellent job of marshalling his evidence and documenting his findings. In the process he helps to dispell a number of long-held and long-cherished misinterpretations of the Anabaptist position.

The book itself is a worthy addition to the excellent studies by Ernst Correll (*Das schweizerische Täufermennonitentum*) and Paul Peachy (*Die soziale Herkunft der Schweizer Täufer*). It is, however, written in English, and therefore makes available a good deal of information not previously accessible to those unable to handle German. More than that, the author goes ahead to discuss a number of issues in a creative way, and therefore the book is a scholarly contribution in its own right.

Among the many reproaches directed against the Anabaptists in the 16th century was that they used religion as a cloak to cover political and economic and social ambitions. With the increase of capable monographs and the new availability of primary sources most of the calumnies of an earlier day have disappeared. This study will help to bury the notion that the biblical Anabaptists were primarily motivated on the economic level, and will show how their ethics of community were in fact an expression of basic religious conviction. The book is a worthy addition to contemporary Anabaptistica, and as such it illuminates the viewpoints and actions of the authorities of the established church and governments as well.

This work, published under the auspices of the International Social Science Council and prepared by members of the Institute of the USSR Academy of Sciences at the initiative of UNESCO, is aimed at familiarizing scholars in other countries with the nature and extent of work done in the social sciences in the USSR since World War II. This publication fills a real need in the field of social science bibliography, for, despite the large amounts of material published in Russian and other languages of the Soviet Union over the past twenty years, no comprehensive survey of the trends and achievements of Soviet social sciences has hitherto been available. The present volume which also includes history provides valuable demonstration of how methods of dialectical and historical materialism may be applied to the social sciences, which will permit specialists to compare the use of these methods in their particular disciplines with their own methodological procedures.

The techniques of empirical social research were developed in Europe 50 or 100 years ago and then were exported from the United States after they had been refined and made manageable for use on mass scale. The present work is part of the effort of a group of young scholars in the Department of Sociology of Columbia University to recapture the history of empirical research and to add it to the existing histories of social concepts and theories. It points out with considerable insight what empirical work in the modern sense the Germans did between the creation of the German Empire and the World War I; it permits us to recast our picture of the history of German sociology and is a fine contribution to the sociology of knowledge itself.
