## **FPS TOURS**

**Galapagos Islands:** we have made arrangements for FPS members to join the Lindblad cruise ship to the Galapagos Islands, leaving London on April 29th; cabins range from £850 per person, including the air-fare from London. If sufficient FPS members wish to go on this tour, arrangements will be made to appoint a leader and for the party to travel together.

**India:** there are still places on the tour of India, in February 1969, which will include Periyar Sanctuary in South India, Kanha National Park in Central India, the Sariska and Keoladeo Ghana Sanctuaries and the Gir Forest in northern India, the Taj Mahal, Akbar's Tomb and Delhi.

**East Africa:** the East African tour covering sanctuaries and parks in Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda, led by our Vice-President, Colonel Mervyn Cowie, also has a few vacancies. This leaves on June 29th and lasts 20 days.

In June also there is a guided 12-day tour to **Iceland** and a 15-day coach and minibus tour of **northern England and Scotland**, starting from Newcastle and including the Farne Islands, the Bass Rock in the Firth of Forth, Handa and the Cairngorm Mountains.
