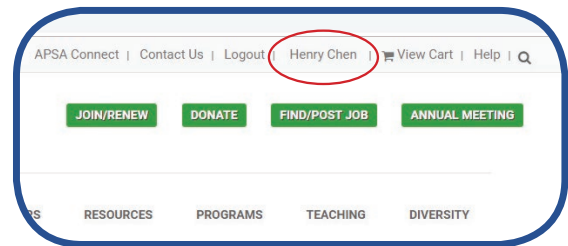

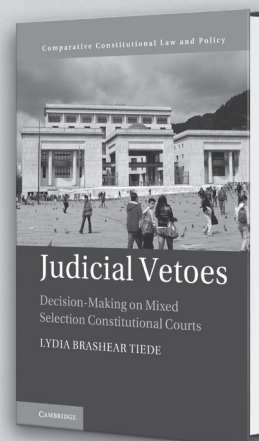
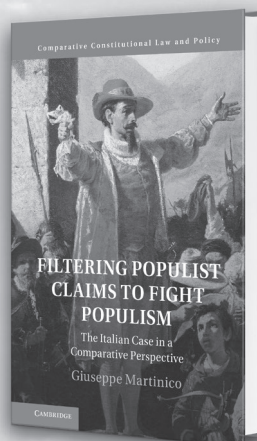
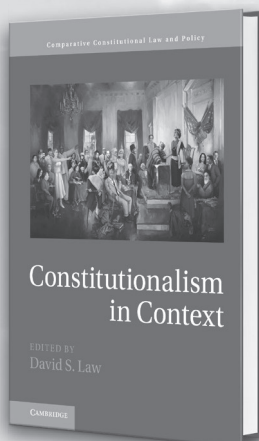
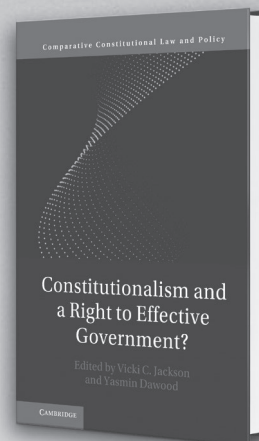
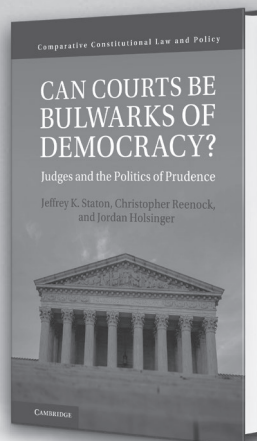
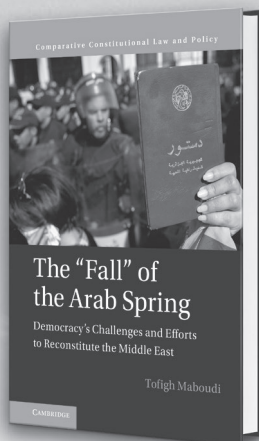


Comparative Constitutional Law and Policy
