# NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN SHEEP PRODUCTION

Proceedings of a symposium organised by THE BRITISH SOCIETY OF ANIMAL PRODUCTION and held in Malvern in October 1989

Papers cover the changes in Europe that are likely to have an impact on the sheep industry, together with the trends in the British sheep industry and the way these might develop in the future. Current breeding schemes are reviewed and techniques for controlling reproduction are considered. Work on grazing and weaned lambs are included. Health problems and the current research on disease control are also highlighted. A major group of papers considers tomorrow's meat market with reviews on carcase quality, market demands and adding value to lamb products. The seventeen posters presented are also reported, covering a variety of genetic, nutritional and husbandry projects.

Delegates, split into workshop sessions, considered the political and technical developments taking place and how these might have an impact on different sectors of the sheep industry. The workshop reports make interesting reading and are included in the publication.

The conference had a distinct 'near market' approach and the publication will be of value to technical and commercial advisers, lecturers and students, farmers, veterinary surgeons and indeed to anyone with an interest in the new developments taking place in sheep production.
