It is more than 25 years since the World Bank Convention on the Settlement of Investment Disputes entered into force. More than 120 States are now parties to it. This unique Convention providing for the international arbitration of disputes arising between States and nationals or companies of other States, has given rise to an important body of case law. Never previously brought together in a single publication, these decisions cannot be neglected by anyone involved in the application or study of the law relating to international investments.

These reports present in a single, comprehensive series all those decisions of ICSID tribunals which are in the public domain, as well as the decisions of national courts relating to such proceedings. All the texts are published in English, translations having been made where the original was in another language. Where full texts are not available, the best obtainable excerpts have been used.

Volume I contains the texts of the awards and decisions in cases that began during the period 1972 to 1981. These are preceded by the basic texts – the ICSID Convention, the ICSID Rules and Regulations, the Additional Facility and the Model Clauses.

All decisions are prefaced by a summary and a key word heading. Consolidated tables of cases and consolidated indexes will appear in each volume.

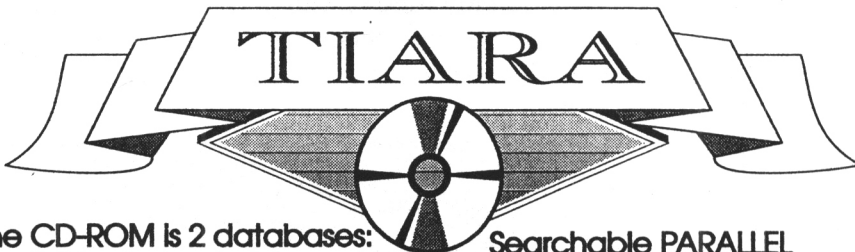

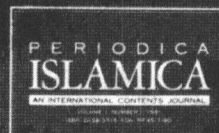
