## CONTRIBUTORS

SARA BERRY is Professor of African History and Economics at Boston University. She has done research on agrarian and socio-economic change in western Nigeria, and written on aspects of agrarian history and economic development in sub-Saharan Africa.

PIERS BLAIKIE is Reader in Human Geography at the School of Development Studies, University of East Anglia. He has done extensive research on development and environmental change in South Asia and Eastern and Central Africa.

ANGELIQUE HAUGERUD is Assistant Professor of Anthropology at Yale University. She has conducted research on rural political economy, agrarian change and household dynamics in Kenya, Rwanda and Burundi.

DAVID KILLINGRAY is Head of the Department of Historical and Cultural Studies at Goldsmiths' College, University of London. He is Book Reviews Editor of *African Affairs*, has co-edited *Africa and the Second World War* (Macmillan, 1986), and is currently writing books on Africa and the First World War and on African soldiers in the two World Wars.
