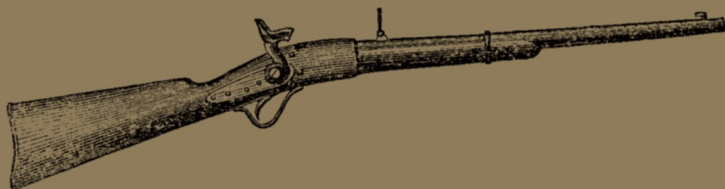

PEABODY BREECH-LOADING CARBINE.

Its form is compact and graceful, and the symmetry of its lines is nowhere infringed upon by unseemly projections, which, besides being offensive to the eye, are often prejudicial to the comfort of the soldier on the march, or in the performance of its necessary manipulations.

This symmetry is preserved while performing the operation of loading, as the whole movement of the breech-block is performed within the stock, the end of the trigger-guard falling but little more than an inch, whereas in most breech-loaders the guard must describe a curve of 90 degrees, and assume a position at a right angle with the line of the barrel, while the breech-block itself drops below the stock.

The rapidity with which it can be loaded and fired is equal, if not superior, to that of any other breech-loader, and in continuous firing, to that of any repeater.

The ammunition is not liable to damage by immersion in water, and is much safer in use and transport than the paper cartridge.
