"I am convinced," this author writes, "that political science, lacking any sort of positive theory, is in a dead end of describing institutions, collecting isolated facts, and occasionally verifying a descriptive hypothesis. My hope is that this manuscript and others like it will gradually provide political science with a body of theory comparable to that of economics, and thus impart a more disciplined tone to the whole field." In what will no doubt be a controversial book, Mr. Riker uses a mathematical formulation—the theory of n -persons games—to develop a theory of coalitions that can be applied to politics. He discovers three important principles (the size principle, the strategic principle, and the disequilibrium principle) which he then uses—in a bold and fascinating, though sobering, final chapter—to predict the future course of Soviet-American relations. \$6.00
