FROM THE EDITORIAL OFFICE

This past year has brought some significant changes to the operation of the Journal.

Tom Hurka, editor and editorial board coordinator, has stepped down after 8 years with the Journal. Dennis McKerlie, University of Calgary, has replaced Tom as an editor, and the position of board coordinator has been combined with that of administrative editor, who will now also serve as board secretary and treasurer.

In addition to Tom's departure in July, Marc Ereshefsky will leave the editorial board this month, to be replaced in the new year by Alexander Rueger, University of Alberta. A hearty welcome, then, to both Dennis and Alex.

With all due respect to changes to the editorial board, the deepest change to the ongoing operation of the Journal has been the retirement of our executive secretary, Anne Williams. Anne spent 21 years with the Journal, and like many largely unheralded individuals in similar positions, she was often the glue that held its operations together. In the face of editorial inertia, Anne was a force of dogged determination in keeping things running smoothly, and at times, at all.

While she was with the Journal, Anne was an even more determined peace activist, active locally and nationally; a member of the Raging Grannies; a piano instructor and player; and a church organist and choir director. She was also an active member of the NDP, an endeavour that required no small amount of determination itself, here in southern Alberta. But Anne has now fully retired, is newly married, and has moved to a new home in a particularly pretty part of British Columbia. We wish her well, and will certainly miss her energy and determination in Lethbridge. The only real question is how long she can stay out of BC politics....
