The Historical Foundation and Its Treasures

This book gives an account of the genesis and development of one of the world's significant collections of Presbyterian and Reformed literature and documents, with a comprehensive survey of its holdings.

History and Home

The story of the Foundation is traced from the discovery of certain manuscripts in a Texas bookshop, in 1902, down to the present, with a record of its adoption as an agency of the Presbyterian Church, U. S., by the General Assembly of 1926, and its removal to Montreat and incorporation during the following year. A detailed description of the building now occupied by the institution is supplemented by a number of pictures.

Holdings

The Appendix is devoted to a concise catalogue of the Foundation's files of minutes and records of the high courts of Presbyterian and Reformed churches and those of the various synods and presbyteries of the Presbyterian Church in the South.

Some insight is supplied into the nature of its ten thousand volumes of periodicals, and an entire chapter concerns the unique, fifteen-hundred-volume, manuscript History of Churches and Woman's Work in the Presbyterian Church in the United States.
