The physical and religious experiences of a young glaciologist serving with British Antarctic Survey; accounts of life during two summer stints on Antarctic Peninsula and South Georgia.

Subtitled 'Being a narrative of the sufferings and adventures of Captain Charles H. Barnard, embracing an account of the seizure of his vessel at the Falkland Islands, &c., 1812–1816'. This is an edited version of a classic story of sealers and marooned castaways on the Falkland Islands, first published in 1829.

The annual Handbook and Directory is an expedition planning manual that includes good advice on defining aims, budgets, fund-raising, insurance and legal liability, choosing scientific objectives, environmental monitoring and health and hygiene; chapters cover the logistics of operating in arctic, desert, forest and mountain regions. The Expedition Yearbook is a list of some 350 expeditions planned for 1985 and registered with the Expedition Advisory Centre, with summaries of 79 of them; these include several polar and near-polar expeditions, of interest to young people planning similar expeditions in the future. The area covered is the east coast of Canada and the west coast of Greenland, including all waters from Baffin Bay south to the Grand Banks and out into the North Atlantic; relevant works on techniques used to study and alter iceberg behaviour (towing, remote sensing, survey and measuring techniques) throughout polar regions are also included.
