The Department of History of Appalachian State University offers to a qualified graduate student an excellent opportunity to study for a Master of Arts degree in History and learn about scholarly publishing by working as an editorial assistant for Albion, a quarterly journal of British studies. The assistant works with the editor in managing the production and editorial operations of the journal. This internship will prepare a student for career opportunities in publishing and/or to continue advanced study in history.

The successful candidate must demonstrate conscientious and accurate work habits, have good language skills, be proficient in typing, and capable of working with word processing and data base applications at least at an elementary level. He or she must have a knowledge and appreciation of the humanities and the discipline of history. He or she must commit to hold this internship for two years, including summer terms, to begin by August 1, 1988. The candidate may enroll for the M.A. in any field of history.
