WHOLE TIME COURSES FOR POSTGRADUATE STUDENTS

15 MAY–27 MAY 1972 and 1 NOVEMBER–14 NOVEMBER 1972

PRACTICAL REVISION CLASS for Part II D.L.O. students.

This is intended for those students who are well advanced in preparation for the examination and need only the opportunity for a final review. The class includes demonstrations of selected clinical cases and viva voce examinations.

26 JUNE–5 AUGUST 1972

INTENSIVE CLINICAL LECTURE PERIOD for Post-Primary Fellowship, Part II D.L.O. and other students.

These periods are primarily designed to give a clinical survey of the whole field of the Specialty as a preliminary to practical clinical training. At the completion of the Intensive Lecture Period, selected students may be given the opportunity to serve as house surgeons in the associated hospitals.

7 AUGUST–11 NOVEMBER 1972

BASIC SCIENCES CLASS for Part I D.L.O. students.

This consists of approximately 50 lecture/demonstrations on the anatomy of the head, neck, thorax and brain; 20 lectures covering the physiological aspects; 6 on applied pharmacology; and 8 on histological and pathological and bacteriological subjects. Facilities are also available for dissection of the relevant parts, and this occupies about 120 hours.

7 AUGUST–2 SEPTEMBER 1972

BASIC SCIENCES CLASS for Students of Neurology.

This course includes 20 lectures on the anatomy of the brain, spinal cord and motor tracts, 6 lectures on the physiological properties and 5 periods of dissection of the brain.

25 SEPTEMBER–7 OCTOBER 1972

ADVANCED REVISION COURSE for students taking higher surgical examinations.

This is limited to senior students who are about to take the Final examination. In addition to a series of lecture/discussions at the appropriate level in the Specialty and in related branches of general surgery, there are a number of clinical and viva voce sessions and arrangements for the setting and correction of test papers.

A copy of the syllabus giving full information about the teaching and research facilities provided by the Institute, and a detailed programme of any of the courses listed overleaf and of the short courses on specific aspects which are arranged from time to time can be obtained from the Secretary-Administrator.

The clinical practice can be joined at any time by individual arrangement with the Dean. This includes daily practical teaching in the clinics and operating theatres and ward-rounds and special demonstrations weekly.

Demonstrations of clinical cases, open clinical lectures and clinical pathological conferences are held at regular intervals throughout the year, and are open without fee to all trainees in the Specialty. A list giving dates and times is obtainable in the Secretary-Administrator's office.

DISSECTION COURSE OF TEMPORAL BONE AND EAR SURGERY

17-24 SEPTEMBER, 1972

The Autonomous University of Barcelona. Service O.R.L. of the Red Cross Hospital, announce:

Dissection Course of Temporal Bone and Ear Surgery, under the direction of the Dr. J. Prades.

Participation limited to 28 applicants—Fee 200 \$ U.S.A.—For Residents 150 \$ U.S.A.

This Course has been programmed in order that during eight days of intensive work, the 28 participants, divided into two groups, could train themselves in all the techniques of the middle ear functional and reconstructive surgery, of the otoneurosurgery and of the facial nerve surgery.

All the days of the Course every participant will be half a day in the Operating room, and the other half a day will be engaged in the Laboratory of temporal bone dissection where everyone will have the use of a microscope and all the necessary equipment to develop, under the direction of a professor, the operative techniques which had been practised in the operating room. All complemented with lessons, discussions, and films.

Language: French, English, and Spanish.

This Course will take place in the permanent Laboratory of temporal bone, whereof the Service of O.R.L. of the Red Cross Hospital of Barcelona disposes and will be periodically repeated.
