

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE EPIDEMIOLOGIST

The Section of Infectious Disease and International Health at Dartmouth-Hitchcock Clinic and the NH Department of Health and Human Services seek an Infectious Disease fellowship-trained Deputy State Epidemiologist (DSE) for the State of New Hampshire. Candidates with a Master's in Public Health, an accredited Preventive/Occupational Medicine Residency, or CDC Epidemic Intelligence Service certification are preferred. This individual will have 0.9 FTE funding from DHHS, for which the person will be based in Concord, NH and 0.1 FTE clinical funding from DH; but the specifics of the clinical time (including the nature and location of the clinical work) could vary depending on the interests and skills of the applicant. The DSE will conduct epidemiological studies, assist in developing research projects, provide support for the state's bioterrorism preparedness and public health plan and direct field activities for disease outbreak investigations. In addition, the DSE will assist with the development of DHMC's hospital-specific Public Health Preparedness and BT plans and serve as an attending physician on the Infectious Disease service. This physician will have an academic appointment with the Dartmouth Medical School.
