Compiled for the purpose of bringing a better balance to Western scholarship concerning Soviet studies, this bibliography annotates over 1,300 monographs and articles (in English and foreign languages) dealing with the non-Russian nationalities of the Soviet Union, with introductions to each nationality section and references to reviews in scholarly journals. The major groups included are the Balts, Belorussians, Ukrainians, Moldavians, Jews, Peoples of the Causasus, Islamic Peoples, Germans, and Peoples of Siberia. Where applicable, these groups have been broken down into subgroups. The publications concerning each of these groups has been further subdivided into general reference works and works in the areas of anthropology and folklore, the arts, economy, government, history, language, literature, and religion.

Stephan M. Horak is Professor of History, Eastern Illinois University, Charleston. His *Russia, the USSR, and Eastern Europe: A Bibliographic Guide to English Language Publications, 1964-1974* was highly recommended in *Library Journal*, *RQ*, and *Choice*.
