Stockholm, 4-8 May 2002 - 11th AEP Congress Program

The 11th AEP Congress will take place in Stockholm, Sweden, on 4–8 May 2002. The theme is “European Psychiatry, Science and Humanity in Health Care.” The venue will be Stockholmsmässan, Stockholm International Fairs and Congress Centre.

The scientific programme will consist of: one introductory lecture; three Plenary Nobel Laureate Lectures; 12 state of the art lectures by leading international experts; 40 continuous medical education (CME) courses in clinically important fields; more than 80 symposia covering the whole psychiatric field of knowledge; a number of satellite symposia arranged in collaboration with the drug industry; workshops, debates and poster sessions.
