- 5 Authors should submit the top copy of their typescript and keep another copy to assist in their correction of proofs.

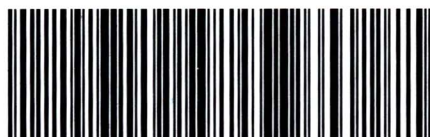
