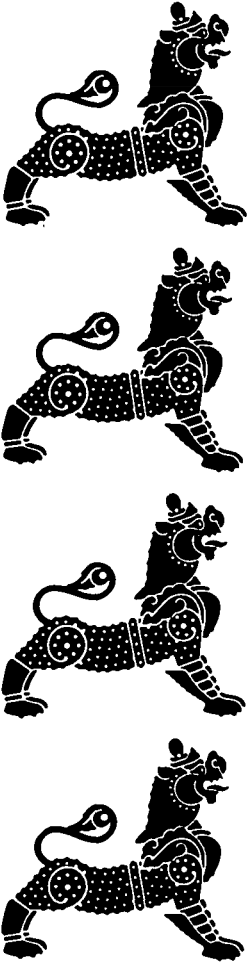

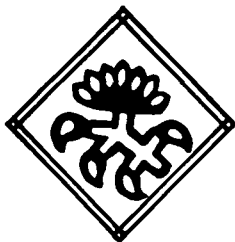

His jailers allowed him only one letter home a month, and only one aerogramme sheet on which to write. The paper was scarcely larger than postcard size, but in minuscule characters, Kim Dae Jung poured out his thoughts and feelings. Kim became a hero to many of his countrymen as a leader of the democratic opposition to the whole sequence of authoritarian regimes in South Korea after WWII. But great popular support never shielded him from constant personal danger; he spent most of the time between 1973-1979 either in prison or under house arrest. This book offers extraordinary insight into modern Korean history and into one man's struggle for democracy and human rights.
