This pioneering work tells for the first time the complete story of the pirates who dominated the coasts and inland waterways of Kwangtung province and who, at their peak, numbered between 50,000 and 70,000 men and women organized into a confederation of six fleets and 2,000 junks. History and Magical Power in a Chinese Community

P. Steven Sangren. This book is a case study of history and culture in a Taiwanese village and the group of rural villages that constitute its standard marketing community. However, its scope exceeds that of most community studies. The author constructs a holistic view of Chinese culture from an analysis of the relationships between history and ritual in a particular locality. Illus. \$39.50

Jeffrey C. Kinkley. The first full literary biography and study of the life and times of one of modern China's greatest writers.
