It is to the credit of Sir Banister Fletcher that, in a monumental book which is familiar to all, or nearly all, devotees of the building craft, he has assigned a page to Scottish work and its individuality. But there has yet to come, from architectural critics in general, realisation that the rarest flights in Scottish Baronial are among the crowning glories of their motherland, and that these works merit a niche of importance in the annals of architecture as a whole.
