

Aims and scope

Byzantine and Modern Greek Studies (BMGS) is an internationally recognized, peer-reviewed journal and one of the leading publications in its field. Published twice a year in spring and autumn, its remit is to facilitate the publication of original research and debate in all areas of Byzantine and Modern Greek studies.

Subscription rates *Byzantine and Modern Greek Studies* (ISSN 0307-0131) is published twice a year in April and October. Two parts form a volume. The subscription price (excluding VAT) of volume 47 (2023), which includes print and online access, is £328 (US\$567 in the USA, Canada and Mexico) for institutions. The electronic-only price available to institutional subscribers is £259 (US\$473 in the USA, Canada and Mexico).

The subscription price for individuals ordering direct from the publisher and certifying that the journal is for their personal use is £88 (US\$166 in the USA, Canada and Mexico), plus a reduced electronic-only price of £65 (US\$121 in the USA, Canada and Mexico).
