AN AFRICAN WINTER

Preston King. Note on Ecology and Famine by Richard Leakey. In this important study, Professor King examines the problems facing the nations of northern Africa: economic relations between former colonial centers and peripheries; natural conditions such as friable tropical soils, uncertain rainfall, and pest infestation; the West's indifference to the impact of its policy and trade decisions on Africa; the failure of new African governments to rise above ideology and self-interested alliances and engage in meaningful policy debates.
