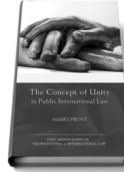
The Right to Development and International Economic Law

'Fragmentation' has become a defining metaphor of international law scholarship in the era of globalisation. Although the subject is highly controversial among international lawyers, there is near-consensus that something is happening today which challenges established visions of international law as a unitary whole. At the same time, the concept of unity, which lies at the very core of the fragmentation debate, is hardly ever rationalised in the literature. Unity is presented as fragmentation's theoretical opposite but its meaning remains vague and intuitive. This book attempts to dispel that vagueness by exploring the various possible meanings of the concept of unity in international law.

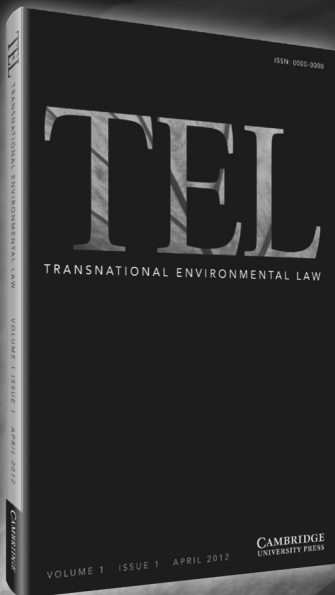

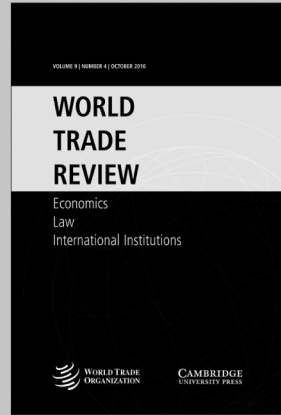
