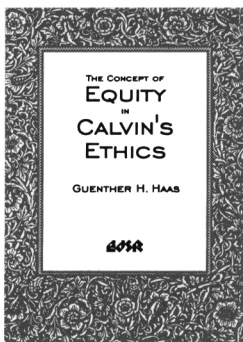

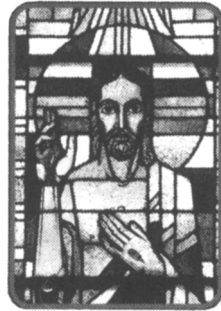

In retrospect it is difficult to accept that Western democracies have implicitly supported, or at least tolerated, the legalized system of white supremacy in South Africa known as apartheid. Renate Pratt's new book, *In Good Faith*, explains why the Christian churches were among the first to publicly protest, and why they provided such cogent and determined international support for the struggle against apartheid.

Renate Pratt was at the centre of early anti-apartheid activities in Canada as coordinator of the leading coalition against apartheid, The Taskforce on the Churches and Corporate Responsibility. Her book, *In Good Faith*, traces the history of exchanges between the Taskforce and successive ministers and senior civil servants of the Department of External Affairs. It details the reluctant and weak responses offered by the Canadian government and business community right up to the time of Nelson Mandela's release from prison.

Renate Pratt's commitment to the abolition of apartheid began during her years in Tanzania, at that time home to many exiled members of southern Africa's liberation movements. Later, she co-authored *Investment in Oppression* (1973), the first enquiry into the implications of Canadian investments in South Africa. Pratt has received an honorary doctorate of laws degree from McMaster University.

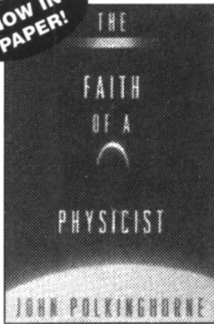

Roger Vandersteene, a Flemish Oblate missionary inspired by the spirituality of the Cree, devoted his life to integrating Cree tradition and Catholicism in a dramatic revision of Catholic ritualism. In *Dissonant Worlds*, Earle Waugh traces Vandersteene's remarkable career: his life among the Cree, his intensive study of the Cree language and folkways, his status as a Cree medicine man, the evolution of his views on the relationship between aboriginal traditions and Roman Catholicism, and his use of paintings, poetry and liturgical modifications to create a new religious reality.

Earle H. Waugh is a professor of religious studies at the University of Alberta. His film on aboriginal religion in Alberta, *The Sacred Circle*, won a gold medal at the Houston International Festival. He is currently involved in the production of *The Alberta Elders' Cree Dictionary*.

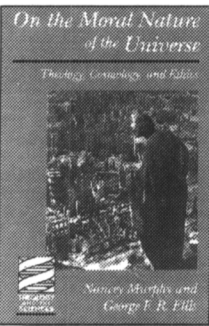

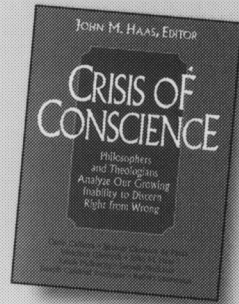

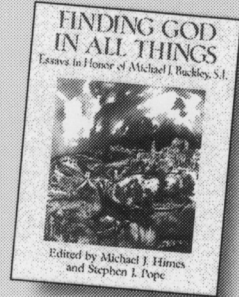
