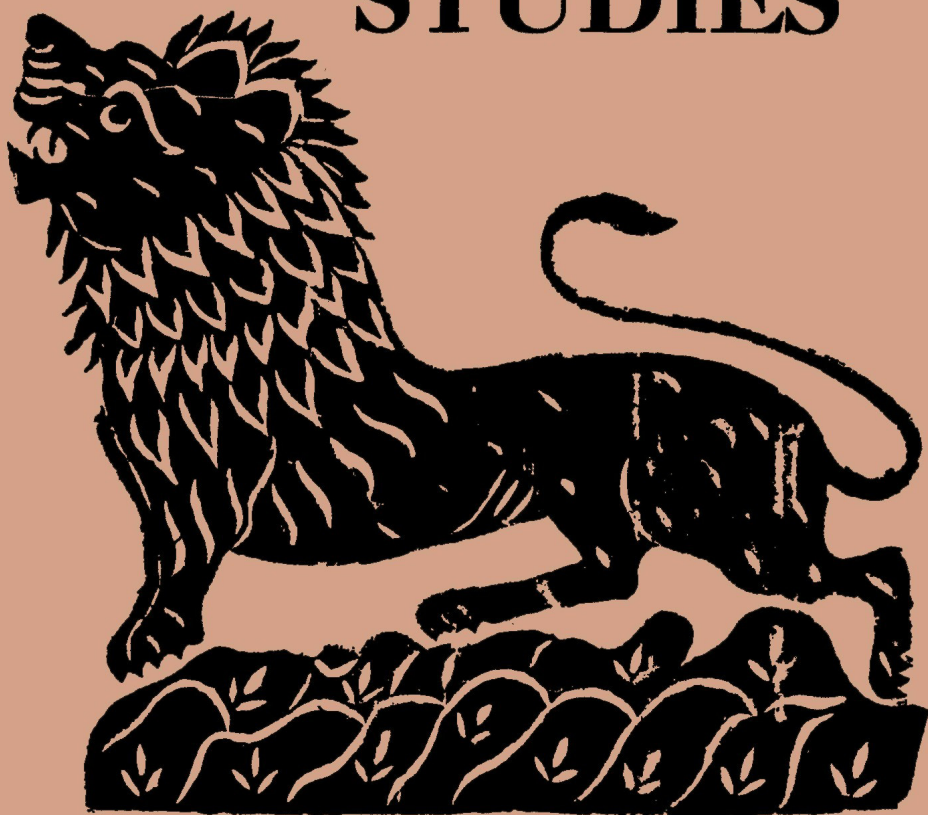

CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

Barrett L. Beer is Associate Professor of History at Kent State University. His articles dealing with the early Tudor period have appeared in *History Today*, *Manuscripta*, and the *Huntington Library Quarterly*. He has recently completed a study of John Dudley, Duke of Northumberland, to be published by the Kent State University Press.

Dr. M. E. Chamberlain is Senior Lecturer in History, University College of Swansea (University of Wales). His publications include *The New Imperialism* (Historical Association 1970), and articles in the *English Historical Review*, *Welsh Historical Review* and *Morgannwg*.

John D. Fair is Assistant Professor of History at Auburn University at Montgomery. He has published an article in *Eire-Ireland* and is at present preparing a book on British politics and constitutional issues from 1867 to 1921.

Francis H. Herrick is Professor Emeritus, Mills College. He is a former president of the Pacific Coast Conference on British Studies and of the Pacific Coast Branch of the American Historical Association. He is the author of numerous articles and reviews in historical journals.

John M. McEwen is Professor of History at Brock University. He is the author of articles and reviews on twentieth-century British political history, which have appeared in American and Canadian journals. He is continuing research in parliamentary history in the 1914-1918 era.

Stanley Pierson is Professor of History at the University of Oregon. He has published articles on British Socialism in *Church History* and in *Victorian Studies*. A book, *Marxism and the Origins of British Socialism*, is soon to be published by Cornell University Press.

David W. Savage is the Director of Special Programs at Clark University and teaches history there. He is editor of *The Imprint of Roman Institutions* in the *Western Man* series.

Charles R. Young is Professor of History at Duke University. He is the author of *The English Borough and Royal Administration 1130-1307* and *Hubert Walter, Lord of Canterbury and Lord of England*, and the editor of *The Twelfth-Century Renaissance*. At present he is at work on a history of royal forests in the middle-ages.
