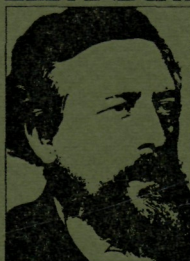

This biography is the first thorough treatment of the life and career of Wilhelm Liebknecht (1826–1900), one of the most prominent founders of German Social Democracy. A pragmatic party leader, Liebknecht significantly influenced the shape and destiny of the German Socialist movement and dominated its Marxist wing, which was characterized by a collectivist, internationalist, antimilitary, and antiwar tradition.
