ERRATA

The following corrections in the summaries contained in *International Organization* for February, 1947, have been brought to our attention:

International Monetary Fund (page 124): A statement that the United Nations and UNRRA had officially requested the Fund for a liberal interpretation of its fundamental agreement, which would allow the Fund to make large contributions for relief and rehabilitation, was incorrect. For correct statements of representatives of these two organizations, see the Report of the First Meeting of the Board of Governors of the International Monetary Fund, p. 124.

International Telecommunications Union (page 148): The Moscow Telecommunications meeting in September, 1946, was not convened by the International Telecommunications Union, although it did hold preliminary discussions on the revision of the convention governing the activities of the Union.

Arab League (page 154): The pact of the Arab League was signed March 22, 1945, not March 22, 1944.

Allied Control Commission for Italy (page 165) and Allied Control Council for Japan (page 169): The word "control" should be dropped from the titles of these two organizations.

Far Eastern Commission (page 176): China was omitted from the list of members of the Commission.

European Central Inland Transport Organization (page 180): The existence of ECITO has been provided for for two years, rather than five.
