

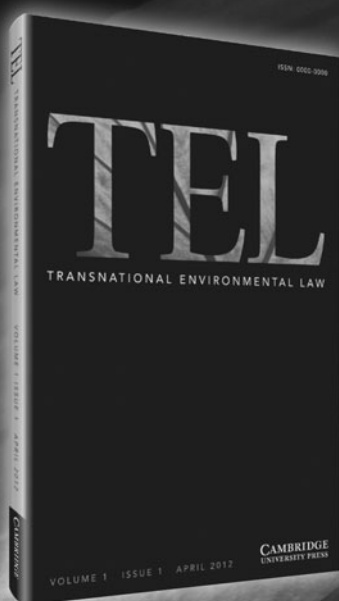

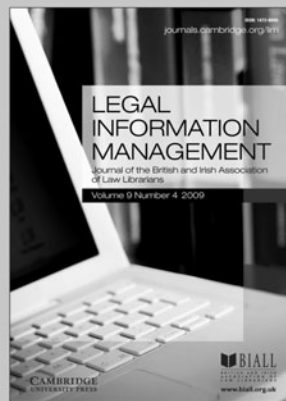

The *Israel Law Review* welcomes unsolicited articles and book reviews. For detailed submission instructions, see <http://journals.cambridge.org/isr/ifc>

To be considered for publication and submitted to the review procedure, submissions should be within the scope of the Journal, as described on the inside front cover. Consideration will normally be given only to original material that has not previously been published. In exceptional cases material that is currently under review elsewhere will be considered. Authors are asked to indicate clearly with their submission if this is the case.

Submissions should be written in good English and so authors are encouraged to have their contributions edited for language prior to submission, where necessary.

Article submissions should contribute specifically to scholarly discussions in the fields of human rights, public law and/or international law, and normally be in the range of 8,000 to 15,000 words (including footnotes), although longer submissions may be accepted.

The *Israel Law Review* welcomes reviews of books covering the Journal's areas of focus. Book reviews are subject to the standard review procedure. Books are not sent to unsolicited reviewers.
