Catalog of the Foreign Relations Library to be Published by G.K. Hall & Co.

The Catalog of the Foreign Relations Library, The Council on Foreign Relations, Inc., New York, will be published in nine volumes by G.K. Hall & Co. of Boston.

The collection, approximately 55,000 volumes, consists of the following: documents of international organizations, including those of such organizations as the Council of Europe, the European Communities, the International Court, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, the Nordic Council, and many others, all fully cataloged; government documents, especially United States, including treaties and hearings involving the conduct of international relations; books and pamphlets, both trade and institutional, in all western European languages. The catalog is in dictionary form--author, subject and title (on a limited basis).

The catalog, containing an estimated 153,000 cards, will be available at the prepublication price of \$475.00 in the U.S. and \$522.50 outside the U.S. After April 30, 1969, the price will be \$590.00 in the U.S. and \$649.00 outside the U.S.

### OECD Liaison Bulletin

The Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development has begun publication of a quarterly Liaison Bulletin Between Development Research and Training Institutes. An Editor's Note explains the purpose of the bulletin:

The OECD Development Centre hopes that the Liaison Bulletin will serve as a tool of easy reference for fruitful exchange and co-operation between training and research institutes in the field of economic and social development. All the information contained herein has been communicated by institutes who wish to establish a functional link between them in the world.

This information is divided into four main headings:

Training and Research News includes information on seminars, study sessions and other pedagogical activities which institutes often organise and which do not form part of their regular programmes. Some indication is also given on news concerning research activities in general. This news is given by country and in alphabetical order.

The heading Research and Documentation in the Institutes reviews research work actually being done or envisaged in the near future, as well as research work completed, published or unpublished, and articles.

Under Notebook of Co-operation information is given in table form on the availability of and need for specialised personnel in the different institutes.

A timetable of "forthcoming meetings" organised by institutes and a table of "forthcoming missions" giving precise details on the travels of a number of experts, enables institutes who so desire to contact one or the other of these experts for a seminar, conference, or discussions on the occasion of a visit in that region.

Finally, the heading Books, Specialised Bibliographies and New Periodicals gives overall information on the most recent documentation available in each institute.

### Africa Bibliography

Africa Bibliography is the title of a report on the International Conference on African Bibliography organized by the International African Institute and held at the University College, Nairobi, 4-8 December, 1967. The report, presented by James D. Pearson (S.O.A.S.) and Ruth Jones (I.A.I.) is published in Africa (London) vol. XXXVIII, no. 3, July 1968. pp. 293-331.

A larger publication to include the proceedings and all the papers read at the conference will be published under the editorship of Mr. Pearson and Miss Jones, in the near future by Frank Cass and Co. Ltd., London.

### Ghana National Bibliography

The Ghana Library Board, Accra, has recently published the Ghana National Bibliography, 1965. Intended as the first in an annual series, the bibliography aims to list all publications, both official and non-official, published in Ghana or elsewhere, and written by a Ghanaian or other nationals during 1965. It includes writings in English and African languages.

### Luo Bibliography

The Luo of Kenya; An Annotated Bibliography, by Carole E. DuPre is the third in a series of studies published by the Institute for Cross-Cultural Research, 4000 Albemarle Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., 20016. The book, 164 pages long, is available from the Institute for \$2.95 (cloth) and \$1.95 (paper).

### French African Bibliography

Afrique Noire d'Expression Francaise, Sciences Sociales et Humaines: Guide de Lecture, a bibliography of the social sciences in French Africa, has been produced by CLEF (Club des lecteurs d'expression francaise) and CARDAN (Centre d'analyse et de recherche documentaires pour l'Afrique noire) and edited by Mme M.C. Jacquey and Mlle F. Niellon. Section I ("Etudes Globales") includes bibliographies and general works under the subject headings geography, history, cultural anthropology, political science, law, social science, and economics; Part II ("Etudes Regionales") covers Burundi, Cameroun, Centrafrique, Congo Brazzaville, Congo Kinshasa, Cote d'Ivoire, Dahomey, Gabon, Guinee, Haute-Volta, Mali, Mauritanie, Niger, Rwanda, Senegal, Tchad, and Togo; Madagascar and French Somaliland are not included. Entries are arranged alphabetically by authors under subject headings in each territory and each section is preceded by a map of the area. There is an author index. (from Africa, Oct., 1968)

### Bibliography of Bibliographies

Bibliography of African Bibliographies (price 7s. 6d.), compiled by Anthea Garling of the African Studies Centre, Cambridge, is based on Theodore Besterman's A World Bibliography of Bibliographies and of Bibliographical Catalogues, Calendars, Abstracts, Digests, Indexes and the Like (4th edition, 1965), supplemented by titles from the African Studies Centre's own current bibliographical catalogue which was started in 1961. Many titles from 1964 onwards have been included from the bibliographical cards provided by CARDAN as a result of the arrangement made in 1966 between the African Studies Centre and CARDAN for the joint preparation of these cards. The bibliography has been arranged by country under general regional headings and alphabetically by author within the countries.
