Diseases of THE NOSE & THROAT

Comprising Affections of the Trachea and Œsophagus

THIS standard Textbook for Students and Specialists, which has been out of print for some time, has been revised in every line by the author.

Among the new features are sections on Dental and Dentigerous Cysts, Hairy or Dermoid Polypi of the Naso-Pharynx, Chorditis Fibrinosa, Keratosis or Leucoplakia Laryngis, and Œsophagectasia.

The sections on Rhinosporidiosis, Stenosis of the Larynx, and Cicatricial Stenosis of the Œsophagus have been rewritten, while those on Avoidable Fatalities, Cocaine Substitutes, Ozæna, and Malignant Disease of the Larynx have been rearranged and enlarged.

The last chapter, on Operations, has been revised and extended, with the addition of new illustrations.

As regards Treatment, Diathermy, Radium and X-ray Therapy have received additional consideration. Facial repair by Cartilage-grafting has replaced the Injection of Paraffin, and new methods are described for Pharyngeal Pouch, Laryngeal Stenosis, Stricture of the Œsophagus, and Double Abductor Paralysis.

Out-of-date pictures have been deleted, and many new figures and eleven new radiographic and other Plates have been added.

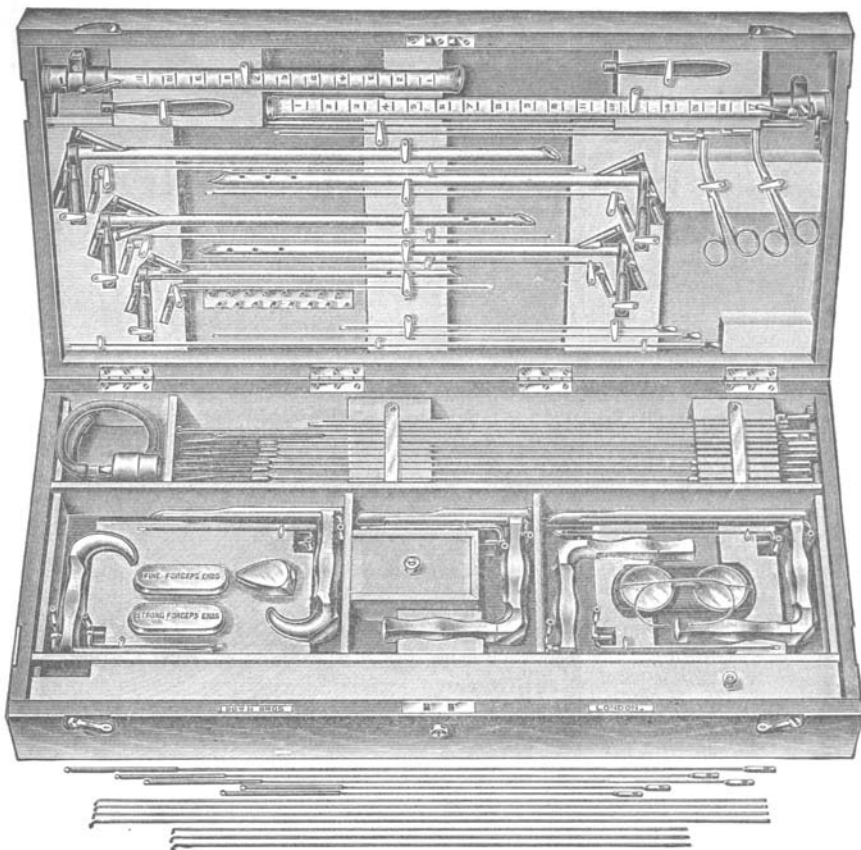

The Hospital, which has for some considerable time been undergoing very extensive reconstruction and extension, has nearly 80 beds for In-patients and an annual Out-patient attendance of over 60,000.

CLINICAL INSTRUCTION

Clinical Instruction in the Diagnosis and Treatment of Diseases of the Ear, Nose and Throat is daily given in the Out-patient Department from 2 to 5 p.m. On Tuesdays and Fridays from 6.30 to 9 p.m. also. Major operations are performed daily, except Mondays and Saturdays, in the In-patient Operating Theatres. Minor operations are performed in the Out-patient Department by the Assistant Surgeons on four mornings a week.

Practitioners and Medical Students are admitted to the practice of the hospital and Clinical Assistants, whose duty it is to assist the staff, are appointed from time to time among them. For further information apply to the Dean, GILBERT CHUBB.
