

THE ROCKEFELLER FOUNDATION

AFRICAN DISSERTATION INTERNSHIP AWARDS

Doctoral students from sub-Saharan Africa are invited to apply to the Rockefeller Foundation for dissertation research support. The program enables Ph.D. students enrolled in U.S. and Canadian universities to return to Africa for extensive research involving field observation or the use of primary sources available only in Africa. Priority is given to research topics in the fields of agriculture, environment, health, life sciences, population, and schooling.

Applicants are responsible for arranging affiliation with an African institution able to provide needed research support, such as laboratory facilities, access to study sites, and technical advice. The candidate's faculty advisors, the host institution in Africa, and the agency with primary responsibility for financing the student's graduate work must all send letters of endorsement. The maximum award is \$20,000. Deadlines for applications are October 1, 1995 and March 1, 1996.

Upon completion of their doctoral degrees, alumni of the ADIA program who return to Africa are invited to apply for Rockefeller Foundation African Science-Based Development Career Awards. Information on these awards is mailed with application materials for the ADIA Program.
