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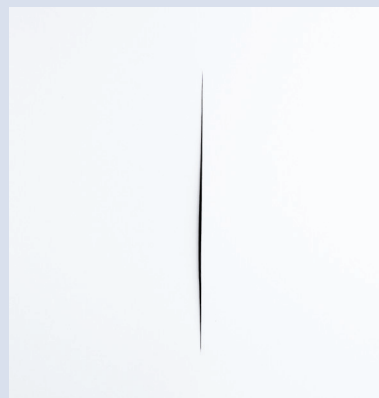

In this issue, Kate Davidson and colleagues (pp. 108–111) take some important steps towards achieving a firm evidence base for treatment of a particularly complex clinical group – patients with personality disorder, often complicated with substance misuse, who self-harm. They present some evidence that manual-assisted cognitive therapy could be acceptable and effective here, and demonstrate the feasibility and desirability of a definitive randomised controlled trial.

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
