INSTITUTE SUBSCRIPTIONS

At the Annual General Meeting held in London on 15 October 1981 it was agreed by Special Resolution to amend By-law 9 to read:

Members shall pay an annual subscription in advance as follows:

Members	Twenty-one pounds (£21)
Student Members	Seven pounds (£7)
Corporate Members	One hundred and forty pounds (£140)

The reason for the proposed increases, which would take effect from 1 July 1982, had been outlined in the Council's Report.
