George of Bohemia: King of Heretics

The young nobleman who became the last Czech to wear the ancient crown of Saint Wenceslas is studied here in the light of primary sources by the author of John Zizka and the Hussite Revolution. The book recounts King George's rise to power through his leadership of the Utraquist Party, his vigorous program of reconstruction after the long period of interregnum and anarchy that preceded his election, his consolidation of royal power within a constitutional framework, his conduct of the Great War in which Matthias Corvinus, King of Hungary, played sword-bearer for the church.

Beset by an antagonistic papacy, a strong Catholic minority, rebellion among his barons, and the ambitions of neighboring states, George achieved the near miracle of victory just before his death in 1471.

The book's interest for students of political and church history is enhanced by the inclusion of a comprehensive bibliography on Bohemia and related aspects of Central European history in the third quarter of the fifteenth century.
