### ALEXANDER BRYAN JOHNSON (1786-1867)

A conference on the centenary of Johnson's death will be held in Utica, New York, on September 8-9, 1967, sponsored by Hamilton College and the Munson-Williams-Proctor Institute. The importance of Johnson's *Treatise on Language* of 1836 went unrecognized until the linguistic approach to the problems of philosophy commanded attention nearly a century later. The advent of communication theory having now permanently established the value of such researches, honor is due to their American pioneer. Attention will also be paid to his close affiliations with John Adams and John Quincy Adams, his works on economic theory, banking, and on American political problems ranging from the Jacksonian era through the Civil War.
