Notes and block quotations should also be double-spaced; notes should be placed at the end of the manuscript and not at the bottom of the page. Library of Congress transliteration and the *Chicago Manual of Style* are to be followed. Manuscripts are sent to outside readers in anonymous form and should be prepared accordingly.

In general, articles should not exceed 8,000 words, excluding endnotes. Please indicate the word count on the cover page of the manuscript. Accepted manuscripts will be copyedited electronically, and authors will be asked to submit final versions on computer diskette. Submissions will not be returned.
